- 1. Personnel records of officers of the German Army and Air Force (rank of Leutnant and above) serving in the Reichswehr and Wehrmacht (name of the German forces between 1919 1945)
- 2. Personnel records of the admirals of the German Navy (very seldom also the personnel files of the rank Kapitaenleutnant and above)
- 3. Personnel records of civil servants of the German Army and Air Force and also personnel records of medical officers, of military judges, of military chaplains and Sonderfuehrer
- 4. Award documents for orders and decorations (e.g. Iron Cross) relating to all ranks
- 5. Records of trials before courts of the Wehrmacht (court martial) relating to all ranks
- 6. Documents concerning the treatment of soldiers in military hospitals from soldiers of all ranks of the Prussian Army, the Navy, Colonial Troops, of Reichswehr and Wehrmacht for the years of birth 1802-1899

For the years of birth 1891-1899 only documents of soldiers born in January and July are preserved

Please note that research in these files is only possible if the exact date of birth is known

- 1. Personnel records of non-commissioned officers and enlisted personnel of the German Army and Air Force
- 2. Personnel records of members of the Navy below the rank of Admiral
- 3. Documentary evidence of the military careers (transfers, promotions etc.) of members of the Wehrmacht and the Waffen SS
- 4. Documentary evidence of prisoner-of-war status of former German soldiers
- 5. Personal references with respect to former prisoners of war in German custody As a rule documentary evidence on captivity as a prisoner of war is stored in the archives of the soldiers' home countries; however, the Abteilung PA also keeps documentation on prisoners of war in German custody
- 6. Clarification of the fates of individuals killed in action and missing persons
- 7. Documentation of locations of war graves (in cooperation with the Volksbund Kriegsgraeberfuersorge)
- 8. Medical records of soldiers born in the years 1900 to 1928
- 9. Documentation about identity discs and notices of loss (by name) of soldiers wounded, missing or killed in action

- 1. Personnel files of members of the SS, Waffen-SS, SA, Police, Reichsarbeitsdienst (RAD), Organisation Todt (OT)
- 2. Membership of the NSDAP and its sub-organizations like NS-Teachers League (NS-Lehrerbund) or Reich Culture Chamber (Reichskulturkammer)
- 3. Individuals involved in proceedings before the Reichsgericht or another supreme German court
- 4. Personnel records of employees of the civilian supreme and higher authorities of the German Reich
- 5. Personal references with respect to prisoners in concentration camps and forced labourers
- 6. Personal references with respect to victims of the "euthanasia" measures
- 7. Individuals referred to as Volksdeutsche (ethnic Germans) who went through immigration procedures at the Einwandererzentralstelle (EWZ; Central Bureau for Immigration) in Litzmannstadt
